Introduction

Congratulations on the purchase of your Hapro Seecret® anti-aging appliance! Hapro International B.V. produces high quality products made with care and craftsmanship. The Hapro Seecret® anti-aging appliances meet the same high standards. This new product line has been developed and assembled in accordance with strictest applicable standards and contains carefully selected, high-quality components. Based on scientifically demonstrated principles, Hapro Seecret® has been proven to vitalise and improve the healthy appearance of your skin in a relaxing manner.

Before you begin using the appliance, it is recommended that you first read this instructions and the accompanying brochure carefully. Among other things the documents contains extensive information about the Seecret® anti-aging concept, it's influence on the skin and the use of the appliance. With this information you will enjoy years of pleasure from your Hapro Seecret® anti-aging appliance.

Important

The information contained in this manual regarding assembly and operation should be followed in full. Failure to do so may render the product warranty or liability on behalf of the supplier null and void. If there is any uncertainty as to whether the instructions contained in this manual have been followed properly and entirely, you should contact the supplier of the appliances.

- 1 Contact your authorised Hapro dealer immediately if the appliance does not function as outlined in this manual.
- 2 Do not operate this appliance in humid and chlorine spaces.
- 3 Always make sure the fuses can carry the load. This appliance has to be protected by ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) of 0.03A.
- 4 Always disconnect the power to the appliance at the wall breaker (isolator) when servicing or cleaning the in-side construction of the cabin. Maintenance for which the procedure is not described in this manual should only be carried out by a qualified electrician. Never clean the electrical components with inflammable and or chemical fluids.
- 5 Ensure that the canopy does not touch the wall when opened.
- 6 Prevent the acrylic sheets from coming into contact with sharp objects.
- 7 The appliance may not be operated if:
- · the acrylic panel in the canopy and/or bench is missing
- one or more of the fans in the appliance are not functioning properly
- the timing mechanism is not functioning properly
- the temperature inside the cabin is 30°C or higher
- 8 To ensure maximum effectiveness, replace the acrylic sheet after 1200 hours.
- 9 To ensure maximum effectiveness, replace the Seecret XL 120W-R emitters after 800 hours and the Seecret 25W-R emitters after 500 hours.
- 10 Check local regulations to find out the proper procedure for lamp disposal.
- 11 DesinFact may be used to clean and disinfect the acrylic sheet. Never use cleaners that contain alcohol, as these can damage the acrylic sheet.
- 12 Emitter and other technical information of the appliance is indicated on the specification sticker.
- 13 If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer or service agent or a similarly qualified person in order to avoid a hazard.
- 14 To replace lamps and starters, remove by turning a quarter turn to the left. Placement of new lamps and starters is done in the reverse to the above mentioned procedure.
- 15 Where applicable, clean the dust filters after every 50 hours of use. Regularly (more frequent than 50 hours) check the dust filters.
- 16 Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- 17 The appliance is not to be used by children or persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction.
- 18 Protect your eyes during session using the goggles provided. Contact lenses and sun glasses are not a substitute for the goggles...

Assembly instructions

Before your Hapro Seecret® appliance leaves the Hapro plants it is tested thoroughly and inspected for defects and damage. We request you when opening the packaging to always check the product for external defects, imperfections or transport damage. Should it regrettably display defects or omissions, please contact your dealer.

Your appliance should be installed carefully using these assembly instructions. You should also check whether the local power supply corresponds to that stipulated on the type panel that is stuck to the back of your unit.

Do not place your appliance in a damp area and make sure that there is adequate ventilation. When in doubt consult your dealer.

Using the appliance

When your appliance is properly installed and functions properly it is ready for use.

Session

As with all safe and painless skin stimulation methods, a single session will not immediately improve the skin. Aging of the skin is a process that takes place over many years, so it should be no surprise that it cannot be reversed with just one session lasting several minutes. To achieve the desired effects and see visible results a series of rejuvenation sessions is required. We recommend that you include in 2-3 rejuvenation sessions per week over a period of 10 to 12 weeks. Keep in mind that a 48-hour rest period is required before you begin the next session.

The results will be measurable after about one month, and you will see visible results after about three months. This differs from person to person, however, and depends greatly on the skin. After three months it may be assumed that the condition of your skin has reached a level at which the frequency of the sessions can be reduced. You can then switch to 'maintenance sessions', once every two weeks.


- A course of treatment during a continuous 10 to 12 week period
- 2 to 3 sessions per week
- Rest period of 48 hours between sessions
- A maintenance session once every two weeks, after completing a course of treatment

As far as is known, from a scientific perspective, there is no need to limit the number of treatments with collagen light. However, based on careful study and practical tests, Hapro International B.V. has established these usage recommendations to help you achieve the most optimal results.

Protective goggles

The protective goggles should only be used with a Hapro Seecret appliance. They should not be used for other purposes. The protective goggles comply with protection class II according to directive 89/686/EEC.

Set time

Coin-operated mode without remote start

The appliance will be started automatically if there is no 'remote start' present on the external timer or coin unit. The 'remote start' can be configured by your dealer.

Coin-operated mode with remote start

Press U 1x to start the appliance.

Stand-alone mode

Press (1) 1x. The maximum time (start time) is shown on the display. The time can be changed with the
and
buttons.

Press (1) 1x to confirm the set time. The appliance is switched on and the time

After setting the time, hold \bigcirc for 3 seconds to return to the standby screen. If no button is pressed for 1 minute, the appliance will return to the standby screen automatically.

Pause

Press (b) to continue

Pause mode

Press (1) 1x during session to put the appliance in pause mode. The lamps are switched off. The body cooling remains on (maximum 4 minutes). Xsens (optional) (optional)is paused.

Coin-operated mode

The remaining time continues to be shown at the top of the display and 'Press (1) to restart' appears at the bottom.

Press () 1x during pause mode to restart the appliance.

Stand-alone mode


The remaining time continues to be shown at the top of the display and 'Press U to restart' and 'Hold button 3 seconds to end the session' appear alternatingly at the bottom. Press 🕛 1x during pause mode to restart the appliance or hold 🕛 for 3 seconds to switch off the appliance. This ends the session, and the required 3 minute cool down period begins.

Note:

The time counter keeps running during 'pause mode'.

Control functions

The \(and \) buttons can be used to select the desired control function. Only the installed options will be shown on the display.




Body cooling

The \(\simega \) button can be used to increase the cooling on the body. The \(\simega \) button can be used to decrease the cooling on the body.

The body cooling can be set to 8 levels.


The body cooling cannot be switched off.



Face cooling

he button can be used to increase the cooling on the face. The button can be used to decrease the cooling on the face.


The face cooling can be set to 8 levels.



Accentlight


The button \checkmark can be used to set the Accentlights to the minimum intensity. The button \land can be used to set the Accentlights to the maximum intensity. The value appears at the top of the display and the text 'Accentlights' appears at the bottom

To switch off the Accentlights, press \checkmark until 'Off' appears on the screen.



Welltherm (Option)

Welltherm only operates, if the body cooling is set on level 5-8.



Xsens (optional)

The button is used to switch on the Xsens. The button is used to switch off the Xsens.

The value appears at the top of the display and the text 'Xsens' appears at the bottom.

When multiple Xsens scents are available, the scent is shown on the right side of the

The button can be used to select the next scent.

The button can be used to select the previous scent.

To switch off the Xsens, press wuntil 'Off' appears on the screen.

This switches on during each session by default.




Music channel selection (with sound system only)

The desired music channel can be selected with the
and
buttons. Only available music channels are shown.

If all the music channels are connected, a choice can be made from the following channels:

'My MP3' and studio channel 1 through 6

If a SoundAround system is connected, the software will detect it automatically. The associated buttons will be activated.



Switch song (with sound system only)

If 'Channel 1' or 'Channel 2' is selected, the 'switch song' function will be activated.

The button can be used to select the next song.

The button can be used to select the previous song.



Music volume (with sound system only)

The
button can be used to increase the volume of the speakers. The wbutton can be used to decrease the volume of the speakers. The text 'Volume' appears at the bottom of the display. The volume can be set to 8 levels. When the session starts this is set to '4' by default.

Messages

Malfunction

When a malfunction occurs, the buttons \wedge , \vee , \langle and \circlearrowleft flash when the appliance is in standby. The appliance also produces 3 rapid beeps once every minute. Press all four of the buttons at the same time to see which fault or faults have occurred. If a critical fault occurs, the malfunction screen appears automatically. The text 'Malfunction' appears at the top of the screen, and the fault code and an explanation appear at the bottom. Use the 🧥 and 🥪 buttons to view the various fault messages. For faults E18, E19 and E22 you can exit the malfunction screen with the \langle or \langle button.



Critical errors:

Note:

When one of the above-mentioned critical faults appears on the display, you should no longer use the appliance and the plug should be removed from the mains outlet. Contact your dealer.

If one of the other faults occurs, the appliance will still function, but not all the functions will be fully available. During fault E18 and E19 the appliance cooling will run at maximum throughout the entire session. To correct this, contact your dealer.

Status menu

Hold the \checkmark , \checkmark and \gt buttons for 5 seconds.

You now see the 'Quick status menu'.

Resetting the hour counters

Navigate to '2. Lamp hours' or '3. Facial tanner hours' and press . Enter the PIN code and press .

The hour counters are reset.

Maintenance



Cleaning

The appliance is equipped with a touch panel control.

To prevent accidental operation of the appliance during cleaning, you can

switch off the control. It is also recommended that you temporarily switch off the control

before you open the acrylic screen canopy.


Hold \wedge and \vee for 5 seconds.

The display shows the remaining time + 'Cleaning'. During this period the display cannot be operated.

The time you have to clean the appliance can be changed.


The standard cleaning time is 1 minute.

If you purchased an Xsens I set, you can replace an empty can with a full one.




If you purchased an Xsens III set, you can replace an empty can with a full one (A). There must always be 3 cans connected.

If you wish to install fewer than 3 cans (B), you must disconnect the supply hose to the can and install the optional plug (P). Always place full cans as far as possible to the left (position 1). In the parameter menu, set the number of full cans that are present by selecting '06 - Xsens' > '02 - Number of Xsens cans'. >



Changing SoundAround (option) memory cards

You can replace your SmartVoice card with a different SmartVoice card.
You can place your own music on the Studio 1 and Studio 2 cards. Only use the supplied memory cards.



Appliance settings

Parameter menu

Hold the , and buttons for 10 seconds.

Enter the PIN code; it is set to 0000 by default. Press 🕛 to confirm.

Parameters

The appliance can be set to your preferences by changing the parameters shown here. The parameters that are not shown in the table may only be changed by your dealer.

Use the and buttons to navigate to the desired submenu and use to select it.
Use the and buttons to navigate to the desired parameter and use to select it.
Use the and buttons to change the value.

If you want to save the new value, press >; the text 'OK' is selected and the text 'Press ^ to confirm' appears at the bottom of the display. Press ^ to confirm. The value is saved and you now return to the submenu.

If you do not want to save the new value, press \langle ; the new value is not saved and you now return to the submenu. Press \langle to return to the main menu.


Press \bigcirc to exit the parameter menu. If no button is pressed for 1 minute, you automatically return to the stand-by screen.

Information on Lamps

The lamps mentioned are a summary of the types that are suitable for use in the appliance.



Cleaning

Always unplug the appliance and let it cool down before cleaning it.

• You can clean the outside of the appliance with a damp cloth. Make sure that no water runs into the appliance.

Never use scouring pads and abrasive liquids such as scouring agents, petrol or acetone to clean the appliance.

• Clean the protective goggles with a moist cloth.

Replacement

Lamp

The light emitted by the lamps will become less bright in time (i.e. after a few years in case of normal use). When this happens, you will notice a decrease in the capacity of the appliance. You can solve this problem by setting a slightly longer session time or by having the lamps replaced.

Always have the lamps and starters replaced by a service centre authorised by Hapro. Only they have the knowledge and skills required for this job and the original spare parts for your appliance.

Protective goggles

Additional or replacement goggles can be ordered at your local dealer.

Environment

- The lamps contain substances that may pollute the environment. When you discard the lamps, do not throw them away with the normal household waste, but dispose of them at an official collection point.
- Do not throw the appliance away with the normal household waste at the end of its life, but hand it in at an official collection point for recycling. By doing this you will help to preserve the environment.

Guarantee & service

Our appliances are manufactured with the greatest attention and are of excellent quality.

Every Hapro Seecret® appliance is manufactured to meet the international IEC/EN standards. We provide a manufacturer's warranty of 1 year. Your new appliance has a manufacturer's guarantee of 1 year, which commences on the date of installation. Within the warranty period all faults that are the result of material or manufacturing errors will be repaired at no cost. Please contact your dealer for any warranty enquiries.

In order to make a claim under the terms of this guarantee, you must be able to produce the original invoice or receipt bearing the date of purchase. The type and serial number of the appliance should also be indicated.

The warranty is subordinate to the national regulations on product warranties.

Not covered under this warranty

Appliances which have the type, serial number and/or other identification labels removed, damaged or altered.

Lamps, starters and acrylic sheets.

Damage due to purchaser abuse, neglect, transport, improper use or improper maintenance.

Damage due to use of accessories not originally supplied by Hapro or inferior accessories.

Damage due to installation, repair or assembly not done by Hapro authorised personnel.

Damage due to fire, lightning, earthquakes or other natural disasters.
